Merging Committee Report - August 2022

#### 8/8/22 Meeting

We opened our meeting with prayer, as we are being intentional in keeping God an active part of this process. We also keep the covenant that we signed during the first meeting prominently displayed as a reminder of the things we are promising one another and the congregation as we have discussions.

This meeting focused on the feedback that we had received from multiple members of our congregation. We wanted to address some of the slight hurdles we've run into and some of the ways that we can improve what we are doing as a committee.

The first conversation was about our communication as a committee and making sure that we are doing a better job of letting people within the congregation know what we are doing and when. We talked about how to simplify the information we are providing and to make sure it is given to people in a more timely manner. We also talked about making sure we are giving more updates during worship and announcements on Sunday. Pastor Brian has also begun working with Anne to create an updated and unified church directory with contact preferences so that we are certain we are reaching everyone in the most effective way.

Our second conversation focused on the struggles we have following two separate church constitutions. Pastor Brian proposed creating a temporary constitution that will outline rules for the committee and congregation to follow until a new, fully-formed constitution can be created and approved. We discussed what things would need to be included to make sure that we are fairly representing the two previous constitutions, while also giving the committee the guidance and flexibility needed to operate effectively.

It was decided that we would move forward with creating this temporary constitution, and agreed to an additional meeting on 8/15/22 to further discuss the document. Every member on the committee was given a copy of their respective constitutions and invited to look through them and bring any ideas and concerns to the next meeting. At our meeting on the 15th, the temporary constitution was discussed further and finalized into the document that was mailed and presented to the congregation.

We agreed to hold a congregational meeting on 8/28/22 to officially vote on the document, and decided to mail out the document and officially announce the meeting on 8/21/22 to meet the 7 day notification requirement that was voted on during our 8/7/22 congregational meeting.

We decided to discuss any lingering issues with the temporary document at our next meeting, and to focus on the budget for 2023.

#### 8/22/22 Meeting

We began our meeting by praying together once again. It is important that we highlight this each meeting because we feel that this committee and process is a faith exercise and we are committee to being Christians throughout this process.

This meeting covered a lot of smaller topics that we wanted to address and finalize before discussing some of the larger issues we are dealing with. We discussed worship and the feedback we have received in order to improve the experience for everyone. We re-ordered some parts of the worship bulletin (moving up announcements, adding an offering section), and agreed to try to create a more firm schedule for worship leaders, communion servers, etc. Pastor Brian will work with Anne to formalize some of these pieces.

A member of the church also suggested that we use some of our extra supplies and equipment to help a church in Kentucky whose building was destroyed by the recent floods. The sub-committee that has been going through Mt. Healthy's storage unit agreed to meet on 8/27/22 to finalize the list of what will be brought into the new church and what can be offered to the congregation in Kentucky. We decided that donating whatever resources we can to help another congregation rebuild after a disaster was a good use of abundance.

We also discussed the upcoming congregational meeting, and made sure that we felt prepared to answer any potential questions we might receive. We believe deeply in the necessity of the temporary constitution and wanted to make sure that we were fully prepared to help the congregation understand why it is important. We also wanted to make sure we were clear on every aspect of it so that we could communicate simply and clearly during the meeting.

Finally, we discussed the 2023 budget that we have been working to finalize. One of our key discussion topics focused on future needs for both the building and the congregation, and wanting to make sure we were prepared for them and financially stable enough to handle them. Steve helped lead the discussion around the building and what potential needs might be forthcoming.

We also wanted to be aspirational and discuss both short and long term hopes for the church, and what financial commitments those might include. This included discussions around the sanctuary (new audio system, projectors, screens, etc.) as well as outreach (how can we be more committed to investing in the community) and programming (choir, youth group/pastor, etc.). We want the budget to be both focused on our expenses for the upcoming year, but also on our hopes and preparations for a growing and diverse church. We also briefly discussed how we can properly invest our assets so that they grow over time as well.

We agreed to add another additional meeting on 8/29/22 to finalize the budget, and members were encouraged to dream big during the week and come back with more ideas about the future hopes of the church.

#### INTERESTED IN BEING WORSHIP LEADERS OR COMMUNION SERVERS? OR BOTH?

If you are interested in helping in some way, but not sure how, here are some needs that we are trying to fill.

Worship Leader - helping with Sunday services to make any announcements and to lead the 'Call to Worship', and possibly some additional parts. This is on a rotation basis. A schedule will be created based on information you provide of when you are available. We are also looking for help in serving communion. This would be to help carry and pass the communion elements to the congregation during the service. A schedule will be created for this as well based on information you provide of your availability. If you are interested, please contact the church office and let Anne know so that she can add you to the rotation.
