Pastor Words of Wisdom

Fall is one of my favorite times of the year. I love the changing leaves, the cooler weather, the chance to visit an apple orchard or pumpkin patch, and the joy of drinking hot chocolate or warm cider around a fire. What's not to love?

Fall also offers us valuable lessons, especially for a church that is transitioning and changing and trying to grow.

Do you know why trees shed their leaves each fall? The cold weather and lack of reliable sunlight means that the tree would have to expend all of its energy just to keep the leaves alive, which would damage the tree itself and possibly kill it.

The tree understands that in order to survive, it must shed the things that will weigh it down and that it must change itself into something new. And not only do trees survive the winter by doing this, but they then thrive come springtime when they have the energy and the space to blossom new flowers and new leaves.

Sound familiar? We as a church are not so different from the trees that surround us. We are also called to change and transform ourselves this fall. We must shed the old ideas and things that weigh us down now so that we can prepare ourselves to blossom anew come January when we introduce ourselves to the wider community.

We were never created to be stagnant and unchanging, but to be transformed in Christ so that the world would know the boundless love that God is offering to us all. Merger Updates

Bi-Monthly Merging Committee Report - October 2022

10/3/22 Meeting

After opening our meeting in prayer, we focused on discussing our mission, vision, and values. We talked about possible mission statements and decided that it might be best to have a mission statement that directly ties to the name of the church, as a way of making a direct connection between our name and what we want to accomplish as a congregation.

Without knowing the name of the church yet, we decided to come up with ideas related to all three potential church names, with the hope of finalizing our mission statement after the congregational vote to decide the name. We asked the question, "what is the first thing that comes to mind when you hear each church name?"

For Church on the Hill, we discussed letting our light shine, being an example for the world, and directly tying the mission statement to the scripture from Matthew 5:14-16. For Anchor Community Church, we discussed anchoring ourselves in Christ and serving our neighbors/community as the two main ideas we would want to communicate. For Journey Community Church, we discussed walking together and with Christ, and how our faith is an active journey that is lifelong. We plan to finalize the mission statement at our next meeting on 10/17/22.

Next we discussed our vision statement, which is where we want the church to go in the future. We agreed that we wanted the vision to include attainable and measurable goals so that we can check in on our progress moving forward, and see if we as a church are living into our vision or not. We want the vision to focus on growth - growing as a church, growing our capacity to help others, growing spiritually, etc. We then discussed what types of goals we could attach to our vision - increasing membership, increasing programs, increasing tithing, increasing outreach. The committee was invited to think more about what specific goals we should include in our vision for discussion at our next meeting.

Finally, we discussed the core values of the church. Pastor Brian provided a list of potential core values to choose from and offered examples from other churches that he has been a part of or worked with. The committee decided that we wanted to get feedback from the congregation before deciding on core values, as the core values will ideally guide the church moving forward (i.e. how does our budget reflect our core values? Our programs? Our worship?). We will be inviting everyone to participate in a core values conversation during coffee hour after church on Sunday, October 23rd.

Merger Updates

Bi-Monthly Merging Committee Report - October 2022

10/24/22 Meeting

Our meeting began with finalizing some smaller things that needed to be completed. Pastor Brian's contract for 2023 was presented and edited, and the committee will review it over the next week before finalizing it and signing it. Things like vacation time and spiritual renewal days were discussed and added to the document to complete it. The committee also discussed ways of improving communication for events, and we have been working with Anne on a document that will ensure that communications for said events are done effectively, and that everyone involved is aware of expectations.

The committee then discussed the results of our core values conversation that happened on Sunday 10/23/22 during coffee hour. We wanted to be sure that the congregation offered their own insight and desires before deciding on which core values to use as a church moving forward. The results were tallied and the committee grouped similar values together (such as acceptance, openness, and inclusion) to narrow down to a list of potential finalists. The committee was provided with a list to go over and will decide a final set of values to present to the congregation at our next meeting.

We also continued to work on the vision of the church, and focused on the attainable and measurable goals for "growing our faith." These goals will help keep the church accountable to our mission and values. Suggestions included creating and promoting Sunday school, hosting multiple Bible Studies throughout the year, hosting non-traditional events to invite non-church people into our community, and talking about ways we can foster and develop spiritual leaders for the church moving forward. We will discuss the goals for "growing our impact" at our next meeting and will hopefully finalize our entire mission, vision, and values for congregational approval soon.

The final thing we talked about was starting the process of creating a new EIN with the IRS, obtaining 501c3 status, and unincorporating the old churches. This is a process that needs to happen before we can create a new bank account, accept donations and tithes, etc. Pastor Brian has reached out to a lawyer to help guide us in this process, and the committee discussed back up options in case this lawyer is unavailable. Other options include utilizing legal advice through ChurchTrac, program we use for our finances, and Brotherhood Mutual who does payroll and offers legal assistance), or starting the process ourselves and inviting a lawyer to verify things at a later date. Pastor Brian will lead this process and keep the committee updated moving forward.

St. Paul Early Learning Center

We finished off the month of October with our Halloween celebrations. The children enjoyed a special snack, wore costumes, and trick or treated through the building.

A special thank you once again to those who supported our cookie dough fundraiser. Together we raised a little less than \$1300.00. This money helps qualifying families afford preschool through our Scholarship Fund.
