Merger Updates

Merging Committee Report - November 2022

Because we are now meeting almost weekly and covering a large amount of topics that span multiple meetings, this report will cover topic by topic what we discussed in November rather than meeting by meeting. Hopefully this will offer a clearer picture of the work we have been doing.

One of the main things we focused on completing during our November meetings was finalizing the mission, vision, and values. We discussed each of the three in depth and solicited feedback from the congregation on the core values. We wanted the mission statement to be short and concise so that everyone in the congregation would be able to easily remember and share it. The final mission statement we will be sharing with the congregation is: "Walking With Christ; Serving Our Community." This statement shares our two main goals as a congregation, while also being simple yet effective.

With regard to the vision statement, we wanted to create attainable and measurable goals for the congregation to strive for annually. The final vision statement we will be sharing is: "Growing our church; growing our faith; growing our impact." Under each of these three categories, we came up with 3-4 goals that we as a congregation will focus on in 2023. Those goals are as follows:

Growing our church

- -Grow our monthly average attendance by 20%
- -Grow our membership by 20%
- -Meet our budgeted number for tithing (\$150,000)

Growing our faith

- -Create and promote Sunday School
- -Host at least three Bible Studies
- -Host at least one unconventional spiritual formation group
- -Host monthly spiritual leadership meetings and an annual leadership retreat

Growing our impact

- -Implement quarterly Giving Sundays (define)
- -Host one new community event
- -Host one new recurring community gathering
- -Create online church experience

Finally, we worked on the core values. With input from the congregation, we narrowed down from the list of 60 core values that were handed out to the congregation. We worked to combine some of the more popular values chosen that were similar (i.e. acceptance, openness, and inclusion are essentially the same values and we chose acceptance as the value that best represents those ideas). The final core values we chose and the definitions we came up with are on the next page:

Faithfulness - We are committed to God, to Christ, to our church, and to one another.

Acceptance - We welcome and accept everyone wherever they are along their faith journey. Respect - We treat everyone with dignity and with the realization that we are each uniquely God's children.

Authenticity - We believe vulnerability opens our hearts to creating true community.

Compassion - We treat one another with love, kindness, and grace.

Growth - We believe that God challenges and encourages us to always move forward in our faith.

We also worked on the legal side of incorporating the new church, both federally and with Ohio. We obtained an EIN (employee identification number) from the IRS. We also applied to be officially incorporated with the Ohio Secretary of State and are waiting to hear back from them. The new church is also tax-exempt and eligible for tax deductible donations moving forward. We will also be opening a bank account soon and start the process of shifting our finances to that account rather than the two older ones.

We've also been working with a local company to increase the technological setup of the sanctuary so that we can stream services online and have TV screens for multimedia usage during services each week. This expense was placed in the approved budget under "future needs" and is something we feel is necessary to modernize our church and increase our reach in the community. Streamed services will greatly help our homebound members, those who have moved away, and new potential families.

Lastly we have begun the process of writing the new church constitution and coming up with the structure and governance that will guide us moving forward. We want to simplify the constitution and structure of the church, as this will help us more effectively and efficiently do the things we need to do as a church. We will also be pulling similar language from the old constitutions of each former church as we are not trying to wholly reinvent the wheel. We will have more updates on this soon.
