Pastor Words of Wisdom

We are finally hitting our summer stride, with the sun blazing and temperatures racing to highs that have forced me to finally turn on my air conditioning.

With the heat comes the inevitable threat of overheating - of pushing ourselves too hard to be out and about and active to the point where we are on the verge of becoming nothing but puddles of sweat.

One of the best ways to avoid overheating is to give ourselves time to slow down, relax, and cool off in the shade with an ice cold glass of water.

We can't keep going constantly, especially when the thermometer hits 90 degrees and the sun starts to burn our skin. We aren't made to move nonstop in the summer. Our bodies need rest or else we can end up putting ourselves in harm's way.

Maybe you can already see where I am going with this! As in life, so in faith. You know what else needs regular rest? Our spirits!

Just like our bodies in the summer heat, a nonstop lifestyle isn't good for our spirits and our faith either. Our faith requires that we sometimes slow down, relax, and cool off in the shade with an ice cold glass of prayer and scripture (am I taking the analogy too far?).

One of my favorite reminders to rest comes from Psalm 46:10, which reads, "Be still and know that I am God."

A poignant reminder, no?

May 8th, 2023 Board Meeting Notes

Steve opened meeting with and Brian prayed at 6:00pm. Five board members and pastor were present.

Sharing of previous meeting minutes were read

Steve asked to include one additional point to Building report - a need to prioritize some work to add exposure and security to the church such as parking lot lights and front light on the cross. Currently getting quotes.

Team/Committee Reports

Building (Skip)

Getting service tech to replace bathroom exhaust fans, kitchen hood fan and motor replaced. Cost \$550.

Lighting quote: Reached out to Mike at Hilltop to get additional estimate to put in motion switches and some other items. Waiting on various quotes.

Board voted to go ahead with American Elevator and their service increase of 5% to \$273 per billing cycle (12 per year).

Getting 2 quotes for tree and Bush Maintenance work around church.

Video and audio update: waiting to hear back from Best Buy quote.

Working on external light quote.

List of keys will be made to share with board and to determine security level recommendations ongoing

Finance (Mike I)

Shared budget numbers (need to verify)

Checking Balance: \$54,251

Savings: \$158,251 Journey: \$786,350

Team is in process of meeting with three investment firms.

Recommendation was made to open an Edward Jones Account for the P&G shares investment (targeting May 16 to transfer into the account). Motion passed 5 to 0.

Teams next meeting is with Johnson investments (Joe Carlos) to discuss investment opportunities.

Motion was passed to allow finance team to retain Griffin Fletcher Herndon firm to work on waterworks exempt transfer to journey community church. Agreed to secure this service for the amount of \$300-\$500. Motion passed 5-0.

Requested and agreed to search for special music talent to supplement and enhance Sunday services (\$50-100 per service)

Reviewing existing job descriptions.

Spiritual (Robin)

Vickie leading sign up for visiting shut-ins

Trudy is working on forming a bible study

Missy working with Brian on Sunday School curriculum

Have enough material to get through summer

Team went to Arbor Day North College Hill celebration giving out seeds with flyers and information for vacation Bible school.

Working on T-shirt designs with a neutral Christian message (Brian)

Discussed potential coffee hour and thank you for Rick's Service is our music Director.

Working to make updates to website content

Pastoral (Brian)

Received approval from board to finalize 501C3 paperwork to get approval from IRS

Requested board to review list sent via email of potential members and then communicate back to pastor those names that board members feel that he should reach out to, invite to church, etc.

A second list was requested to also be reviewed regarding membership giving.

Outreach budget – Brian and Robin to work with spiritual team to make recommendations for outreach opportunities.

Shared modifications to playground fencing and agreement based on the learning center, church, and city regulatory considerations.

Recommended purchasing a Dictation to text software to help with no taking of board notes.

Provided additional updates regarding the learning center grant monies to be used to improve facilities. Shared tile recommendations for floor to also be used at sanctuary Church entrance.

No pictures as of yet from Big Munson Island, but some of their fun on the way down.




