Pastor Words of Wisdom

I know it might seem early to be talking about Halloween already, but it's almost October and the passage of time never seems to stop, does it? Which means it's time to talk about Halloween!

Halloween is one of my favorite holidays (though I must admit that I enjoy pretty much every holiday). It's a time when people get to dress up and pretend to be someone or something else for a night, wearing masks and collecting candy.

But I sometimes wonder if some of us take the spirit of Halloween and carry it with us throughout the year. By which I mean, how often do we wear masks and costumes and pretend to be someone else?

One of our church's core values is authenticity. We define that as "we believe vulnerability opens our hearts to creating true community." It's a good value to have and a noble goal to strive for.

If only it were that easy. I think authenticity, and by extension vulnerability, is one of the most difficult values to live into. We are constantly pressured by the world and by others to be something else or something different or something that makes sure we are the same as everyone else.

We are often afraid to be our true selves, because we fear we might not fit in or that others will judge us for who we are. It's scary to be authentic and it's scary to be vulnerable.

So instead we put on masks and costumes and walk through the world pretending we are someone else. But God did not create us to be someone else. God created us to be *us*. God created you to be *you*.

Each of us is created in the image of God, and our uniqueness and specific existence are special and worthy and perfect-as-is.

Halloween is a fun time to pretend to be someone else. The rest of our lives are not. It is painful to hide who we are and it is damaging to think that who we are isn't good enough.

My hope is that our church and community is a place where we are all comfortable being exactly who we are. Where we don't have to fear being judged when we are authentic and that it is safe to be vulnerable. Like our core value says, it's in vulnerability that we find community.

So this Halloween, have fun wearing a mask and scaring children. But the next day, make sure you take it back off so we can continue to see the real you - the one created in the image of God.

Steve opened meeting with and Brian prayed at 6:08pm. Five board members and pastor were present.

Finance Funds Investment Discussion

- Finance team shared Edward Jones investment proposal for \$300k of the investable funds primarily from the selling of the Mount healthy Christian Church building.
- 300k portfolio breakdown

250k mutual funds

50k individual stocks and cash

- Reports and portfolio breakdown with specifics, along with fee structure was shared with the board.
- Goal of this investment is to obtain some dividend reinvestment and to have funds available to meet our annual budget needs as needed. (Ex. During summer when giving and attendance is typically down)
- A motion to move forward with proposed strategy with Edward Jones passed 5 to 0 in favor of this allocation of 300k.

- Voted on computer replacement for office last week and were able to get additional discount from Best Buy.
- Mike B. is working with Best Buy to expedite the installation of updated A/V sanctuary system.

August 14, 2023 Board Meeting Notes Continued:

- Skip to review Best Buy contract and working with Mike to expedite next steps to complete the install as soon as possible.
- Motion was passed 5-0 to give Anne permission to move forward to sign documents for employee retention credit program (ERC). This program should result in the church getting a credit reimbursement.
- Motion was passed 5-0 to commence with stewardship promise campaign.
- P&G shares paperwork will be received soon.

Building (Skip)

- Lights are fixed in the parking lot and the light that shines on the cross in front of Church.
- Electrician will be working to fix dusk to dawn timer.
- Electrician to put motion sensors in all the bathrooms to help save energy.
- Motion was passed 5-0 to work to install a new ductless mini split AC system in the head start room. Estimated cost: 10-11.5k.
- Leaks upstairs in sanctuary are fixed.
- Working on getting more quotes for additional AC needs for building.

Personnel (Ben)

- Continuing efforts to hire a full-time musician/music Director.
- Met with Skip and Steve to review updated Sexton job description.
- Continuing to work through and update job additional descriptions.
- Steve and Ben met with Rob to provide feedback regarding Rob's performance as well as to ascertain more information regarding his specific duties in Cleaning the Head Start area.

Spiritual (Robin)

- Team conducted a service opportunities ideation session.
- George our fill in organist and the guest jazz trio are alternating leading music Sundays currently.
- There are sign-up sheets for Sunday school teacher participation
- It was discussed and agreed that information for the Sunday bulletin Will have a Thursday deadline for finalization.
- Trudy has begun a Bible study on Thursdays at 6:30 PM in the café.
- Kim and Darlene are beginning a card ministry
- Missy is setting up a CPR AED training
- Working on stewardship involvement, developing a tailgate community get together for NCH on September 29, their homecoming, as well as a fall cookout on September 24.


