The name has officially, in Kroger's records, been changed to Journey Community Church, but it still may say St. Paul United Church of Christ on the website. They associate more by account number than name of business.


PARISH NURSES

March meeting notes read and approved with minor edits.

Team/Committee Reports Finance (Mike I)

- Discussion regarding Deb S. will be available to run payroll while Anne is on vacation as needed.
- Treasurer report accepted. See attached.

Building (Skip)

- Passed out quotes from the electrician (HillTop)to repair the following.
 - Light for the cross in front of the building
 - Replace the portico lights.
- The Board gave go ahead to proceed
- Discussed the potential of removing the two trees from the Narthex courtyard and pastor courtyard. Skip requested a quote from a tree removal company.
- All new HVAC equipment is now operational.
- Discussed the replacement for Jim Maybury. Will meet with Ben for further discussions on hiring Kim Ferry.

Personnel (Ben)

- Have completed Pastor's review
- Personnel team to meet with Skip and Kim to go over Sexton job description and align to expectations.
 - May 19th is Kim's official start date
- Need to regroup and move on creating key tasks descriptions and process for essential Administration (Anne and Dee) and Sunday Tech (Mike B. and Ben).
- Discussion on payroll changes, along with review process and timing.
- Moving forward Personnel will gather feedback for employees between Nov 15th and December 15th each year
- Employee reviews to be conducted between January 1st and February 15th
- Any payroll increase will happen starting March 1st of that year

Board Meeting Notes Continued **Spiritual (Robin)**

- 11 Volunteers showed up to help with gardening on Saturday, May 10th
- Trudy finished an Easter Bible Study
- Twelve people attended the first book club. The next book will be "Sisters Like Us" by Susan Mallery and the group will be meeting on April 29th in the café.
- Everyone is preparing for VBS which is just around the corner.
- A community cookout is in the works for Saturday, July 12th.
- We are considering doing a "Fall into Jazz" evening sometime before Thanksgiving.
- Board discussed taking the time to look around each Sunday to see who might be missing that week and work to reach out to each as appropriate.
- Mike I. volunteered to head up Pairs and Spares for June.

Pastor Report (Brian)

- Pastoral Care 15 visits 2 funerals 45 phone calls Includes check-ins, new visitors, counseling, and prayer - Does not include common questions/conversations that reflect dayto-day work
- Rev. Allen Harris Regional Minister for the Ohio Region of the Disciples of Christ Will be preaching on May 18th - Wants to start building more bonds between church and denomination - UCC is in process of hiring a new Association Minister and I hope to invite her to come preach soon as well
- Offering Cards Way to reflect the things our congregation is doing/offering outside of just financial tithing

- Membership Sundays Last Sunday of every month Happens during the service A time for people to join the church, reaffirm their membership/faith
- Pastor Vacation June 23rd-29thJuly 14th-17th

Additional Business (Steve)

- Towing signs have been installed at both parking lot areas. Sawyer Towing has already removed one vehicle from the back lot. We need to install at least one more sign for visibility in the back lot, which is being used heavily by the complex tenants across the street.
- Review three applicants criteria for the Zwoster Scholarship. Dylan (Mike and Patti's
 grandson), Allie (Judy, the Dir. of our learning Center, daughter), and Logan (Steve and
 Robin's grandson). The scholarship team recommends all three candidates for the award. One
 applicant has questionable total hours recorded but meets the criteria minimum hours
 regardless.

- We have made no progress on our outdoor signage requests. Currently there is no permanent fixture that identifies the name of our church.
- Each Board member needs to send their meeting notes to Ben in Word format.
